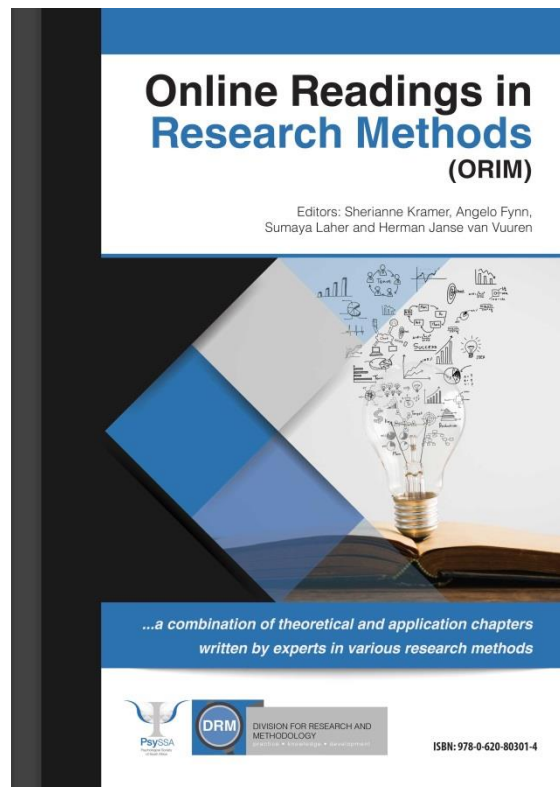


Call for Manuscripts for Online Readings in Research Methods (ORIM)
